My dear friends, brothers and sisters in our Lord Jesus Christ

Last few weeks I have been reading the book of Joshua. Especially its first chapters are amazingly inspirational and I recommend you to read them. Every single line offers a great encouragement for our personal but congregational future. Let me share with you a couple of ideas.

Here is the scene. God freed the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt. But because of their disobedience, they have been living in the wilderness for 40 years. - Moses has just died, and now it is Joshua's turn to lead the people. The older, disobedient generation is gone, and the younger generation is ready to do what God tells them in order to enter the Promised Land. - They are close to fulfilling their dream but Joshua is afraid. He knows that once they enter the Promised Land they will be facing at least 7 enemy nations that are very strong, very well trained and armed. - It is not any wonder that Joshua is hesitant to take this final step. - So God appears to him and says, "Joshua, let me tell

you a few things. If you follow them I guarantee you won't be disappointed. – Here they are:

A. The first thing that God says to Joshua is, "Set my plan into motion." – But before Joshua could do that, there was something else he had to do. He had to let go of the past. – God began His speech by saying, "Moses my servant is dead." – Moses was God's chosen man. He freed the people, led them out of Egypt and brought them to the border of the Promised Land. – Now Joshua has to fill his sandals.

Faith is an action!

Faith is never passive.

He has to take his place. – You can imagine the fear and tension he must have felt. – But God comes to him and says, "Joshua, listen! – Moses is dead, but I'm not and you are not. I have a plan for your life, and I have a plan for

my people. So let's get on with the plan. "This is a message for us too. - If we only look back we will never move forward. Previous failures will hold us back and take our focus off the goal. – We need to know that God always has a good plan for us even though it looks like it won't work. God sees things from a different, much better perspective than we do and so His plan is always better than ours. Now look at the change that happened. Joshua ordered the officers of the people: "Go through the camp and tell the people, 'Get your supplies ready.' Three days from now you will cross the Jordan and take possession of the land the Lord your God is giving you for your own." - You know that in our congregation we made plans for the next three years. We were asking God for His .. direction to reveal His will for us. We set goals in our vision. Now is the time to get ready for hard work. Of course we don't know what the cont'd pg 4

The Church in my Life

My fascination with the church began already when I was a child. It was a place where I felt safe and loved to go to. I was devastated when the church was destroyed in 1943 by bombs, the same time we also lost our home. My father was at war, so my mother went with us 3 children to her father's house in Black Forest and away from the bombings. I started to go to school there in grade 7 where there were 48 students of which 45 were Catholics and 3 were Lutherans. There was no Lutheran Church in that town so the three Lutherans from class walked 5 km every Sunday to

church service and 2 times a week to confirmation classes. It was good exercise and we were never overweight.

In 1947 we moved back to Mannheim and started to rebuild our lives. With no help from anyone my parents sold there property ... cont'd pg 2

and immigrated to Canada I week after I got married. Two years later we followed and lived with them in Willowdale. We tried to find a Lutheran church but there was none. We sometimes went to a German speaking Lutheran church in Toronto. Then one day in 1957 our doorbell rang, it was a pastor and he told us that on Bayview and Finch there will be a Lutheran church built and that for me was music to my ears. It was Pastor Schweder who was the founder of St. Lukes. We started church services right away, sometimes in funeral homes or in a school. My son Eric was baptized in the school on Finch and Bayview. We became members of St. Lukes in 1957 and were very active members until we moved to Newmarket in 1990. I was in charge of the altar, communion and pastor's gowns. I also sewed all the altar linens by hand because at that

time, you were not allowed to sew them by machine. Until the beginning of the

1970's St. Luke's didn't do very well. The membership declined and we almost lost our church. We searched for a new pastor and got one of the best, Pastor Marvin Janz. Our membership started to grow and we became a happy church family.

Beautiful is the large church, With stately arch and steeple; Neighbourly is the small church, With groups of friendly people; Reverent is the old church, With centuries of grace; And a wooden church or a stone church Can hold an altar blace.

And whether it be a rich church Or a poor church anywhere, Truly it is a great church If God is worshiped there.

After retirement the Janzs moved to Gil-

ford and the Bauers to Newmarket. We had our daughter and a son living there.

Every time Pastor Janz was doing the service at Christ the King, Norma called me and invited me to come to the church service. This is how I got to know this church and the people. In the beginning of 2011 I became a member at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church and met our Pastor Dusan Tillinger when he was installed on February 6th, 2011.

The Great Flood of 2013 at Christ Lutheran

"Hello"

"Hi Bob, it's Dusan. Are you busy right now? Can you come to the church?"

"Sure - is there a problem?"

"Yes, I'm standing in the basement in 2" of water!!"

"I'll be right there"

And so it started! I grabbed a utility pump I had saved for some reason I was just discovering. I mean, who needs a utility pump in a town home! Got to the church, and sure enough the basement had been transformed into a wading pool. Within a short time, Mike G and Steve arrived and, armed with the utility pump, two shop vacs, two big squeegees, shovel and pails, we set about

trying to remove the water which was coming in almost as fast as we were removing it. Finally, we prevailed and were able to see that the water was coming in at a number of points around the foundation. Not able to find a sump pit or outlet, we assumed the weeping tiles were hooked into the storm drains and that the tiles might be plugged up. Meanwhile, Mike had called our insurance company who sent out a restoration team. By the time they got there late that night, the basement had flooded again and they set about removing water and setting up dryers and fans and left for the night.

Next morning, I arrived to find the basement flooded again, got the pump and squeegees going again and Mike and I waited for the insurance adjuster and restoration manager to arrive. They too could not find sump pit or outlet and came to the same conclusion.

Bad News! Deductible for this type of flooding was higher than the probable cost – we were on our own! Since we had not yet corrected the problem and water was still coming in, very expensive dryers and fans were not of any real benefit, and we directed that the restoration company remove their equipment.

Good News! Jerry returns home from his trip and, learning of the flood, arrives at the church, knows where the sump pit is, finds the pump not functioning and places another utility pump in the pit to remove the water. It took a day at least, but ... cont'd pg 7

future will bring but God assures us that He will always be with us in any situation.

B. The second thing God tells Joshua to do is to "Stay in the Word. Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." - Did you notice? - We need to talk about it, discuss it, and learn it. - We need to talk with each other about what God is teaching us, and how He is working in our lives. We need to share with each other. - You can't benefit from what God is doing in my life if I don't tell you. And I can't benefit from what God's doing in your life if you don't tell me. Then, God also says, "Think about it. Meditate on it day and night." The word "meditation" has fallen on hard times because when we hear it we often think of someone sitting cross legged, in some kind of a trance. But "meditation" is a good Biblical word. If you want to understand what it is, consider this: "Worry is

negative meditation." That's all, worry is constantly thinking about all the bad stuff that could happen. That's negative meditation. – Positive meditation is thinking about what God can and will do, and how He can work in our lives. Then God says, "Do it! Put it into practice. Be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." Take the teachings and principles out into the world, and live them every day.

C. The third thing God told Joshua to do was: "Step out in faith." We need to understand that faith is an action. Faith is never passive. – Faith isn't a sporadic coming to church where we assure ourselves that we are saved. That's not faith. – It is not enough to say, "I believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Satan believes that, too! – Faith is not real until it is active as you commit your life to Jesus Christ, and say, "I not only believe in you, Lord, but I trust my life to you, and I'll follow you wherever you lead me." – That was what God was asking of Joshua – to make a commitment and

trust Him in every situation.

D. Now Joshua needed to cross the Jordan River in order to get out of the wilderness but obviously he was not ready to make that step. So how is God going to get him and all the people across this raging river? - God says three times to him, "Be strong and courageous!" "Be strong and courageous!" "Be strong and courageous!" And continues, "Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." - Fear will keep you always in the desert and never allow you to enjoy God's gifts. - What was the problem here? When Moses led the Israelites to the Red Sea, God opened the waters for them to cross on dry land. But that's not what happened here. "Now the Jordan was at flood stage during harvest. Yet as soon as the priests who carried the ark reached the Jordan and their feet touched the water's edge, the water from upstream stopped flowing. It piled up in a heap .. cont'd pg 6


Praise God in Song

spiritual relationship to God. Snack time too of course;)



a great distance away." (Joshua 3). Picture this scene: here come the priests carrying the Ark, walking toward the Jordan River. Then they step into it. They stand knee deep in the water, but the waters didn't part like when Moses raised his staff at the Red Sea. – Then they take another step. They're waist deep in the water, but the water is still rushing past them. What happened? Isn't God going to do something? – Then they take another step, they're chest deep in the water. And I can just imagine that the priests are thinking, "How far

does God expect us to go before He does something?" – You see, God was testing their faith. What actually happened? The moment the feet of the priests touched the water, God did His thing up there, but the water kept flowing and they kept getting deeper even though God had already done what He was going to do. – What's the point of this? The point is that the first steps of faith are always the hardest ones. God expects us to keep stepping out in faith even though the water is getting deeper because He has al-

ready done His thing. He has dammed up the water, so that we could reach dry ground. God has already defeated sin. He has won the victory on Calvary for us. But we're still standing knee deep in the water, waiting for the effect of His miracle to take place in our lives and in our world. The apostle Paul said, "I can do everything through Him who gives me strength." (Phil 4:13) – So be courageous and in trust step out of your faith and start to work for Christ who will be always with you.

Milk Bag Mats for Haiti

Have you ever wondered what happens to your Milk Bags when you are done with them? Well until recently they might have ended up in a landfill, where they take up to 15 years to disintegrate. But children around Canada are putting these Milk Bags to good use. These Milk Bags can be cut into strips and then weaved into mats for children living in Haiti. Haiti is still recovering from the

devastating earthquake a few years ago. Many people are still homeless or sleeping on the ground. The mats provide a sanitary place for people to sleep.

The process is really a simple one. The outer Milk Bag is cut into four strips, which is then looped together to make chain. The chain is then set up on a frame and weaved together. Making one child size mat

can take up to 600 bags.

The Sunday School Children have started this outreach program. Milk Bags can be dropped off in the basement in the box marked 'Milk Bags'. The children will then take the Milk Bags and weave them into something useful.

finally the ground water level around the foundation dropped and the water flow into the basement stopped.

Members responded to my call for fans and dehumidifiers which we set up to dry out the basement. At one time, we had eleven dehumidifiers running full time, removing many gallons of water as the basement gradually dried up. The failed sump pump has now been replaced, and a back up unit has been in-

stalled. The basement is dry now, and the task of putting things away and restoring order is underway.

So, what have we learned? Unfortunately, the sump pit in the furnace room was covered with so many articles from past events, that it could not be seen by first responders, insurance adjuster or the restoration company, and incorrect conclusions were drawn by all. For this and other reasons, we must

change our habits and keep the furnace room and utility room clear of such odds and ends. A plan of checking sumps annually is also a must. On the plus side, it could have been a lot worse, and positive action by all of us can help to prevent another "Great Flood"
